FILMING

Ely Cathedral is a beautiful, flexible and unique location. As an established filming and recording venue, it is favoured by producers, artists and film & television companies alike. Regarded by the industry a 'film friendly' location, they have experience in large productions, with a cast & crew of over 400, to accommodating smaller recordings for TV.

Previous filming at the Cathedral includes *The King's Speech*, *Elizabeth: The Golden Age*, *The Other Man* and *The Other Boleyn Girl*. In addition the Cathedral has hosted a series of *Flog It!*, and has been a location for TV productions including *Escape to the Country* and *Saturday Kitchen*. The building itself predominately featured in two highly acclaimed television series *How Britain was Built* and *The Normans*. In 2009, the Cathedral was chosen as the location to

host a special, BAFTA event celebrating the film career of Michael Palin in *BAFTA presents Michael Palin: A Life in Pictures*.

Adjacent Cathedral buildings and the grounds and parklands have been used to accommodate catering, crew tents, technical support etc., as required.

Ely Cathedral is listed on IMDb – *Internet Movie Database*.

RECORDING

The generous acoustics of Ely Cathedral create a perfect recording location. John Rutter, The Britten Sinfonia, Trinity College Choir, Cambridge and Polyphony are just a few of the musicians and artists who have used these facilities for recording purposes.

The Lady Chapel, in particular, is famous for its special acoustic properties,



can be closed off from the main body of the Cathedral offering both audio & visual privacy.
